The Handicapped Services Division administers the Group Activities Program for the Handicapped (GAP), which provides a unique social-recreational experience for developmentally disabled town residents in a well supervised setting. The focus of the GAP is group interaction. These programs are offered at both north and south shore locations in the Town. During the summer, the GAP provides a special six-week camp experience for children ages five to 21. The program is offered at Town community parks on weekdays from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. For further information, contact the Handicapped Services Division. Between October and May, GAP offers an Over-21 Tuesday Evening Program, a Wednesday Evening Drama Program for those 16 and older, a Thursday Afternoon Bowling Program for ages five and up, and a Saturday Morning Swim Program for everyone. There are additional programs once a month for those ages five to 15, and for ages 16 and older. Once a month a Saturday Night Respite Program is held for those age groups as well.

GENERAL SERVICES DESCRIPTIONS

A. RESIDENTIAL SERVICES Individualized Support Services (ISS) Funded by New York State. Provides funding to eligible consumers to assist these individuals to live independently in the community. An individualized support services grant supplements such expenses as room, board, and other support services.

Community Habilitation Services (Comm. Hab.) Funded through Medicaid (Home and Community Based Services Waiver). Provides community habilitation services from consumer's own home.

Supportive/Supervised Apartment Certified by OPWDD and funded by Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and N.Y.S. House or apartment providing an environment that fosters independent living with minimal supervision. Program includes socialization, supported or sheltered work and travel training. Supervision is limited.

Supervised Community Residence (CR) Certified by OPWDD and funded by Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and New York State. Program provides on-site supervision and clinical supportive services primarily for individuals who need some training and experience in activities of daily living, socialization, and independent living, but who require 24-hour supervision. This category includes any programs that are termed supervised apartments. **Family Care (FC) Certified by OPWDD** and funded by Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and N.Y.S.

Certified Family Care homes provide a structured and stable home environment, and create an atmosphere of family living, including the support, guidance and companionship found within a family unit. The responsibility for ensuring treatment and support services remains with the agency.

Individual Residential Alternative (IRA) Certified by OPWDD and funded through Medicaid (Home and Community Based Services Waiver). Provides room and board. Supervision and programming determined by individual need. IRA's serve a variety of behavioral, medical or supervisory needs.

Intermediate Care Facility for the Developmentally Disabled (ICF) Certified by OPWDD and funded through Medicaid. Provides room and board, 24-hour supervision and active programming; including training in activities of daily living (toileting, bathing, dressing, and grooming), socialization training and independent living skills. Specialized Intermediate Care Facility's (ICF) serve individuals with a variety of behavioral and/or medical needs.

GENERAL SERVICES DESCRIPTIONS

B. EMPLOYMENT & DAY SERVICES

Supported Employment is paid competitive work performed by individuals with severe disabilities who require support services to obtain and sustain employment. It is performed in an integrated setting which provides regular interactions with individuals who do not have disabilities and are not paid caregivers.

Day Habilitation (Day Hab.): Day habilitation services are aimed primarily at developing those activities and skills outside of a person's home that assist him/her in developing a full life in his/her community. The services help an individual become a contributing member of his/her community as well as develop satisfying and rewarding connections and relationships in the community. These services are very flexible and can be provided almost anywhere in the community where an individual would like to learn new skills.

Prevocational Services (Prevoc.): Prevocational services are aimed at preparing an individual for paid employment. Prevocational services teach such concepts as following directions, attending to task, task completion, problem solving, and safety. Basic understanding of job performance requirements is also important aspect of prevocational services. The purpose of the service is habilitation rather than teaching a specific job skill.

Day Treatment (DT): Day treatment is a planned combination of diagnostic, treatment, and habilitation services provided to persons with developmental disabilities in need of a broad range of clinically supported and structures habilitation services. Regulatory changes have been made to foster person centered planning and community inclusion in this program.

Sheltered Workshops/Work Centers: Sheltered workshops/work centers provide paid work to people with disabilities in a controlled and protective work environment. Attendees are considered "client workers" rather than employees of the workshop.

They are copies of brand-name drugs and are the same as those brand name drugs in dosage form, safety, strength, route of administration, quality, performance characteristics and intended use." Generic drugs cost about **50%-80%** less than their brand name equivalents. **** Please consult your physician before making the switch****

Nassau County FCAP is a foster-care advocacy program in which trained volunteers assist the Family Court by fact-finding, interviewing, and reporting on children in foster care. The volunteers, known as Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASAs), are interested men and women from all walks of life, trained by EAC Network to work with program staff, children in care, and the courts. Each child who is in foster care has his or her case reviewed periodically by a Family Court judge. At the time of the case review, if the judge needs additional information, or would like an objective opinion on the child's placement and progress, the court will appoint a CASA volunteer. All appointments are made through the Nassau County Family Court Advocate Program, which then assigns volunteers based on availability, skills, and the needs of the particular case.

Safe Start is a family centered safety program designed to promote child passenger safety through driver education and public awareness campaigns. The program educates parents how to use effective and appropriate use of car seats, booster seats and seat belts to help prevent injuries to children and occupants of all ages. Operates fitting stations in Nassau and Suffolk Counties. Provides free education to community groups, families, schools and day cares about child passenger safety. Safe Start promotes the safety of all occupants riding in motor vehicles in order to reduce the number of children riding unrestrained. Thus, a major component is community outreach and subsequently, conducting educational workshops. Safe Start hosts permanent fitting stations in Nassau and Suffolk Counties that offer safety seat inspections by certified technicians. The program's van offers a mobile fitting station to provide these services to parents in need at unlimited locations. In addition, complimentary child safety restraints are provided to clients most in need.

EAC, Nassau Supervised Visitation allows children to continue, rebuild, or establish a relationship with their non-custodial parent without being placed in the middle of their parents' conflict and/or other issues, which results in children having a better chance at being responsible citizens and developing healthy attachments, and allows custodial parents to have comfort knowing their children's interaction with the non-custodial parent is safe. Besides standard supervised visitation, SV also offers therapeutic and coached family visitations.

EAC, Nassau Enhanced Supervised Visitation (ESV) is offered to families involved with the Department of Social Services and/or the foster care system. In addition to providing supervised visits, ESV specifically focuses on enhancing parenting skills by providing assistance, encouragement, information, and coaching to parents during visits, family coaches engage and empower parents to be experts on their own children; they are encouraged to identify, understand, respond to their children's needs, and have fun with them.

EAC Nassau Family Treatment Court Supervised Visitation (FTCSV) is by referrals only from Family Treatment Court in cases where parents have been found neglectful as a result of alcohol and/or substance abuse. Because the FTCSV office is located in Family Treatment Court, intakes are completed immediately after a judge makes the visitation mandate, and visits are able to be scheduled within a week. Rather than held at the SV facilities, FTCSV supervised visits take place either at the family's home or at a community/public location such as a library or restaurant. In a few rare cases, the Department of Social Services will host a supervised visit. Additionally, FTCSV offers monitored visits: rather than EAC Network staff acting as supervisor, staff personally check in with court-appointed supervisors who are conducting the supervised visits.

The legislation that created the Department of Financial Services, known as the Financial Services Law, was introduced as part of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo's 2011 budget. The Governor's purpose in consolidating these two agencies and creating the Department of Financial Services or DFS is to modernize regulation by allowing the agency to oversee a broader array of financial products and services, rather than the previous system of limiting regulation to services provided by only certain types of institutions. As of October 3, 2011, the New York State Banking Department and the New York State Insurance Department are abolished, and the functions and authority of both former agencies transferred to the New York State Department of Financial Services. The department supervises state- chartered banks, handles or refer problems and complaints about other types of financial institutions as well answer general questions about banking and consumer credit.

After a preliminary conference or when deemed appropriate by the Judge, a case can be referred to a volunteer attorney who serves as a neutral evaluator.

The Supreme Court has broad authority over all categories of cases, including civil and criminal matters. The court generally handles civil matters seeking monetary damages greater than \$25,000. It also hears cases where a party seeks to enjoin or stop certain actions by another party. The Supreme Court is the only court with the authority to address matters related to the termination of a marriage, including separation, annulment and divorce.

While the Supreme Court has authority to hear criminal matters involving felonies (offenses punishable by more than one year in prison), generally outside New York City these matters are heard in the County Court.

The District Court has authority to hear criminal matters involving trial jurisdiction over misdemeanors, violations and infractions, preliminary jurisdiction over felonies and traffic tickets charging a crime.

Services may be provided free, without regard to income. A caseworker will visit the person in his/her home within 24 hours, if the allegation is life threatening; and within 3 working days if non-life threatening. Adult Protective Services uses a case management approach to evaluate eligibility for counseling, financial management services, and medical services. Housing Programs

If a family or individual is threatened with eviction or foreclosure, assistance may be available to save the current housing. These emergency programs are:

Emergency Assistance to Adults (EAA): provide assistance to individuals in receipt of Supplemental Security Income (SSI) who are facing emergency situations such as homelessness, utility or fuel emergencies, or other items of need.

Emergency Assistance to Families (EAF): provide assistance to families to meet emergency situations that are sudden, not foreseen, and beyond their control. Such needs may include but are not limited to, homelessness, fuel needs, and utility shut offs. The household must include a minor child who is without immediately accessible resources to meet his needs.

Emergency Safety Net Assistance (E-SNA): provides assistance to persons not eligible for recurring public assistance benefits, EAA, or EAF. The individual or family must present an emergency need and be without immediately available income or resources to meet the emergency. The income standard for E-SNA is 125% of the Federal Income Poverty Line.

Family Assistance (FA): Family Assistance (FA) provides cash assistance to eligible needy families that include a minor child living with a parent (including families where both parents are in the household) or a caretaker relative. FA operates under federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) guidelines.

Safety Net Assistance (SNA)

• Safety Net Assistance (SNA) provides cash assistance to eligible needy individuals and families who are not eligible for FA). SNA is for:

- Single adults
- Childless couples
- Children living apart from any adult relative
- Families of persons found to be abusing drugs or alcohol
- Families of persons refusing drug/alcohol screening, assessment or treatment
- Aliens who are eligible for temporary assistance, but who are not eligible for federal reimbursement
- Recipients of SNA who are determined to be able to work must also comply with work requirements to receive SNA benefits.
- Generally, you can receive cash SNA for a maximum of two years in a lifetime. After that, if you are eligible for SNA, it is provided in non-cash form, such as a payment made directly to your landlord or voucher sent directly to your utility company. In addition, non-cash SNA is provided for:
 - Families of persons found to be abusing drugs or alcohol
 - Families of persons refusing drug/alcohol screening, assessment or treatment
 - Families with an adult who has exceeded the 60-month lifetime time limit.

Teaching Family Homes

Catholic Charities Teaching Family Homes serve children ages 5-18. A specially trained, live-in married couple teaches the skills necessary for children to live successfully in a family, attend school and live productively in the community. With continuous training and supervision, a therapeutic environment is maintained which allows for treatment and family style living. There is an emphasis on working closely with the child’s family to attempt to reunite the family upon the child’s discharge.

Community Residences

Family and Children’s Association – Lakeview House A residential program that provides a therapeutic milieu environment to adolescents ages 13-17 with serious emotional disturbance. It is an out of home placement that provides a structured therapeutic environment and restorative services to assist in stabilizing and maintaining their symptoms and behaviors of their mental illness and reunite the family upon discharge.

Mercy First – Merrick House

The Community Residence is staffed 24 hours a day with awake staff. It houses eight male youth ages 9- 14 with serious emotional disturbances. Residents can learn the skills of emotion management and self- care that will enable them to return to their families. In addition, they work with staff on developing their independent living skills, socialization skills, behavior management, medication management, and more. Staff and youth continue to incorporate the Sanctuary Model into the fabric of the Merrick Community Residence program. This is accomplished by youth using Sanctuary tools and trauma sensitive interventions both in the residence and with their families at home.

Well Life Community Residence

The Residence is a 24-hour staffed program. It provides direct supervision and guidance to eight emotionally disturbed adolescent males ages 13-17. The program provides an intensive therapeutic environment and restorative services including but not limited to behavior management, counseling services, independent living skills, daily living skills, socialization skills, medication management, health services and family support services. The goal of the program is to teach the youth necessary skills to be able to return home with their families or community-based placements.

CO Family of Services - Deer Park Community Residence

The program provides an intensive therapeutic environment through 24-hour coverage by staff trained in behavior management, child/adolescent development and the treatment of mental illness. Additional therapeutic linkages are provided through a strong community involvement with outpatient mental health settings, medical providers and educational/recreational settings. The goal of this program is to provide a structured, supportive and therapeutic environment that will equip these children with skills necessary to live at home or in a family like setting in the community. Co-Ed ages 13-17 years.

Residential Treatment Facility RTF

Provides fully integrated mental health treatment and special education services under the direction of a psychiatrist in a well supervised residential setting. RTFs can serve youngsters between the ages of 5 and 21 years of age, but each program generally serves only a portion of this total range. Most youngsters are served for an extended stay, between 6 months and 2 years. Access to an RTF is through the Preadmission Certification Committee (PACC) under the guidance of the Office of Mental Health.

Outpatient Treatment Services

A partial hospitalization program shall provide active treatment designed to stabilize and ameliorate acute symptoms, to serve as an alternative to inpatient hospitalization, or to reduce the length of a hospital stay within a medically supervised program. A partial hospitalization program shall provide the following services: assessment and treatment planning, health screening and referral, symptom management, medication therapy, medication education, verbal therapy, case management, psychiatric rehabilitation readiness determination and referral, crisis intervention services, activity therapy, discharge planning and clinical support services.

Nassau County residents, first responders and human service staff learn how and when to administer the lifesaving antidote that can reverse the fatal effects of an Opioid overdose and save a person’s life. Our free Narcan trainings also offer community resources, speakers and information on the latest treatment approaches.

Nassau County Office of Mental Health, Chemical Dependency and Developmental Disabilities became certified as an Overdose Responder Program in late 2012, the first County Certified Program in the State, outside of New York City. Nassau County Office of Mental Health, Chemical Dependency & Developmental Disabilities Services has partnered with community agencies, colleges, local school districts, fire departments, libraries and religious organizations and has hosted more than 210 training events and has trained more than 9800 people on how to administer Narcan since its inception.

Naloxone Co-payment Assistance Program (N-CAP)

Under New York State Department of Health's Naloxone Co-payment Assistance Program (N-CAP), individuals can access low-cost or no-cost naloxone at pharmacies across the state. At participating pharmacies, individuals with prescription coverage as part of their health insurance plan can receive up to \$40 in co-payment assistance for the purchase of this lifesaving drug. Uninsured individuals and individuals without prescription coverage can receive naloxone at no cost through New York's network of registered opioid overdose prevention programs.

The Hofstra Law Clinic provides certain types of legal services to individuals who are 150% above the poverty line.

Students in the Robert W. Entenmann Veterans Law Clinic help veterans obtain disability (and thus, often, health care) benefits and apply for discharge upgrades.

More particularly, students may help veterans submit disability claims to the Department of Veterans Affairs, Work on appeals of denied claims, and, help veterans obtain increases in disability ratings, for cases in which increases are justified by a veteran's service record and health status. Students may also help veterans upgrade other-than-honorable discharges from the military so that these veterans become eligible for disability and health care benefits. Working alongside physicians, other clinicians and experienced attorneys, students help veterans with service-connected disabilities establish that their disabling conditions are service-connected.

SANE is in a separate area of the Emergency Department, specifically designed for interviewing, examining, treating, counseling and comforting adult victims of rape and sexual assault. Together, a physician and a SANE nurse (trained in the examination of adult sexual assault victims) provide medical assistance, emotional support and information. They also physically examine victims to collect forensic evidence that can be used in the prosecution of the offender.

North Shore University Hospital is a designated NY State Region Level I Adult and Pediatric Trauma Center, as well as a NY State Department of Health designated Center of Excellence for our Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program. SANE provides sexual assault victims with confidential and private, on-premises, care, available 24 hours a day/7days a week. At the discretion of the patient, police are involved in patient care and follow-up. SANE is a collaborative effort of: Special Victims Squad of the Nassau County Police Department, Nassau County Coalition Against Domestic Violence (NCCADV) and Sex Offense and Domestic Violence Bureau of the Nassau County District Attorney's Office
